the Faculty of Philology, Psychology and Foreign Languages of Vasyl' Stus Donetsk National University is pleased to invite you to the international scientific conference "Topical Issues of Studying Germanic, Romance and Slavic Languages and Literatures and Methods of Teaching Foreign Languages", which will take place on 21-22 June 2024 at Vasyl' Stus Donetsk National University (Vinnytsia, Ukraine).

We encourage PhD Candidates, Candidate of Sciences, post-graduate students, Master's Degree students as well as instructors of higher educational establishments to participate in the conference.

The scope of the conference includes but is not limited to the following:

- 1. Current Trends in Germanic, Romance and Slavic Language Development.
- 2. Contrastive Linguistics.
- 3. Cognitive Linguistics and Psycholinguistics.
- 4. Studies in Historical Linguistics and Literature.
- 5. Intercultural Communication and Translation.
- 6. Innovative Linguistic and Methodological Approaches in the Foreign Language Teaching and Translation.
 - 7. Literary Studies.

The **floor languages** of the conference are Ukrainian, English, German and French. The conference will be held in hybrid format (in person and remotely).

Participants intending to take part in the conference should submit the following up to 11 June 2024:

- 1) online application form (the form is filled out by all the participants).
- 2) **abstract** in MS WORD (.doc) format compliant with the requirements. **Note**: The paper should be sent together with online application form and the title of the file should include the author's last name with the section number, for example, *Nazarets_abstract_5*.

The certificate will be provided to all the participants of the conference.

The results of the conference will be outlined in the collection of abstracts in e-format posted on the page http://journals.donnu.edu.ua two weeks after the conference.

Submission guidelines:

- 1. Abstract should be up to 4, but not less than 2 entire pages (pages are not numbered).
- **2. Page format** should be A4, margins -2 cm on all sides, line spacing -1 pt, font size -14, font Times New Roman, paragraph indent -1 cm; dash (-) and hyphen (-) should be clearly differentiated.

3. Text formatting:

- first line: last name and first name should be right aligned and in **bold italics**; scientific degree, academic title should be in *italics*. Next line should display the full name of the higher

educational establishment in even font, and then the next line should contain the name of the city and country in even font (see a sample below).

- one line after should be left blank and then the title of the abstract should be typed in the center in **bold** capital letters.
 - all the highlights in the text and examples should be on *italics*.
 - **bold font** should be used only for headlines.
 - underline should not be used in the text.
- **4. Shortenings**: Abbreviations should be provided for the terms and concepts used for the first time in the text in round brackets, for example, base noun (BI).
- **5.** Figures and tables should be grouped and arranged according to the text clearly within the printed borders of the page with portrait orientation. All textual information on the figures should be clear and legible. Figures with text and graphic elements should be inserted into the text in the form of a graphic object, which provides the possibility of its editing and formatting. Each figure should contain a caption and each table should have a title.
- **6.** APA style should be used for **references** (<u>http://www.citationmachine.net/apa/cite-a-book</u>).
- In-text references are placed in round brackets (Wilkinson, 2008, p. 69). Preference should be given to the sources published in the last 10 years in refereed periodicals or collective monographs.
 - There should be no more than **5** references.
